



1 Use a steady, gentle flame. We recommend the Wax Seals Australia Refillable Gas Torch. Hold the wax stick angled down toward the site of the seal, ignite the torch, and play the flame downward on the top surface of the stick. This will minimise overheating, where the wax burns and deposits black soot into the seal.

2 As the wax drips, move the stick and torch to form a pool about the same size as the face of the seal. Turn off the torch before this point is reached, as wax will continue to fall. Keep the stick over the pool until drips stop. For a different effect, you can sprinkle glitter over the wax at this point, before pressing the seal in place. Or, after the wax has cooled, you can go over the monogram with a gold or silver marker.

3 Wait about 5-7 seconds, and then press the seal into the wax, hold for 2 seconds, and remove. If the seal sticks to the wax, let it cool and then remove it. If there is wax stuck to the seal, flick as much as possible off with a thumbnail, and remove the residue with nail polish remover.

4 If the seal is unsatisfactory, carefully remelt the blob and apply the seal again. If using wax buttons, refer to the instructions on the wax buttons box.



5 If you are doing more than two or three seals at a sitting, you will get best results if you chill the seal between impressions. Putting the seal on a plastic bag of ice between applications will allow continuous use.
